facilitating of research collaboration between PhD students from different universities.

The KLI wants to facilitate research collaboration between PhD students from different universities. As you may have experienced already, interactions between PhD students during KLI meetings and conferences sometimes result in the development of new and exciting research ideas. However, because these ideas are usually not part of PhD projects, it can be difficult to find the necessary budget to carry out the studies and put these ideas to the test. The KLI aims to stimulate and facilitate collaborative research projects between PhD students by a seedmoney grant. In this scheme, PhD students can apply for funding up to €3.000,- to be spent on costs that would enable research: e.g., participant fees, study materials, etcetera. We are not able to fund travel cost or conference fees. Applications that are eligible for funding should include at least 2 PhD students from different universities and applicants should have obtained approval from their supervisors to work on this project.

The main applicant has to be a KLI PhD member, *and* has to be employed by a Dutch University. The other applicant(s) need(s) to be a PhD student, being employed by either a Dutch or international University.

The call will be send twice a year, once in April and once in September. The application deadline will always be one month after the call. And one month after the application deadline you can expect a response from the KLI manager. You can submit your application by sending an email to Hannah Timmermans (KLI.manager@uu.nl). Your application will then be reviewed by the research committee consisting of Ilja van Beest (TiU), Terence Dorés Cruz (UvA), Anita Keller (RUG), Barbara Nevicka (UvA) and Iris van Sintemaartensdijk (UvT).

When you get awarded with the grant you will receive a seedmoney grant number. We want to ask you to refer to this number in publications and presentations.

After finalizing the project (but before 1 year after having received the funding) the KLI requires recipients of the funding to: (1) Provide a financial report (so please make sure to keep track of expenses, because the KLI would like to receive receipts and invoices); (2) write a short report about your experiences and findings for the research committee to read, and maybe for placement on the KLI website.
